They work with booking agents, airlines, cruise ship companies, hotels, car rental companies, and tour companies to plan the right kind of vacation for each of their clients. They spend a lot of time on the computer and on the telephone to gather information for the trips they plan. Travel agents need to understand computers, be detail oriented, like working with different kinds of people, and have a good understanding of geography.
